Key achievements to date until July 2024:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
All of current year 5 have had sports leader training again this year and in the last term did 'Path to Paris' training looking at activities around the Olympic games in Paris.	We have looked at getting a new PE provider for the next academic year. They will provide support for the sports crew at lunchtimes and 2 afterschool clubs. These clubs have changed from this year after discussions with the children.
Continued replenishment of equipment on the playground with the addition of some extra trim trail equipment. As a result, active play has increased during play times and lunchtimes.  This year we have offered basketball, golf, gymnastics and spy clubs after school which have been well attended. Children across the whole school have participated in school games events again this year including 9 inter school events and 8 intra school events. This has been down on last year due to staffing availability and minibus driver. However, we have still managed over 88% of the children in the school participated in sport in some form. Children in reception, KS1 and KS2 have also participated in pacesetter games throughout the year across a number of different sports. PE lessons have gone well with all children participating.
